JACKSON CITY COUNCIL

Minutes from January 11, 2010 7:00 p.m. Regular Session

Jackson City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 11, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at the Jackson City Council chambers. President Ron Speakman called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was given, led by Mr. Smith. The Prayer was given, led by Mr. Powell.

A roll call was taken as follows:

Mr. Smith made a motion to hire Tera Brown as council clerk, seconded by Mr. Brown. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

Mr. Adams made a motion to appoint Mr. Brown President Pro Tem, seconded by Mr. Elliott. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

Mr. Smith made a motion to approve the minutes of December 29, 2009 regular session seconded by Mr. Brown. In a voice vote, all Council agreed.

VISITORS

COMMITTEE REPORTS

UTILITY - No Report

Mr. Brown stated he will be scheduling a meeting to review the base rate before March. Mrs. Colby stated she had concerns with the electric rates, power supply cost and fuel adjustment cost. Stating in 2009 the electric fund generated a \$5 million surplus. Mr. Eric Brown stated that will all be changed with the base rate, full package. Mrs. Colby asked about industrial rates. Mr. Brown stated he would notify Mrs. Colby of the meeting date.

BUDGET & FINANCE - No Report

Mr. Adams stated he looks forward to working with the new committee members and establishing the 2010 permanent budget.

POLICE, FIRE & TRAFFIC - No Report

RAILROAD

Mr. Fain scheduled a meeting on January 21, 2010 at 6:00 p.m. to discuss litigation with US Rail, would like to work toward a resolution and property in Lawrence County.

BUILDING/RECREATION - No report

CITY AUDITOR

Mr. Humphreys stated he had passed out the monthly report for December 2009. Reminded council that there would be a meeting prior to the regular meeting on January 25, 2010, this is a budgetary meeting, for council and administration only.

LAW DIRECTOR

Mr. Detty gave his report, see attached. He notified council that he did receive a letter today from the Ohio State Auditor in regards to adopted legislation for rents and right of ways, has not had an opportunity to fully review. Reminded that the cemetery levy will expire in 2011, stating he would like to see on the November ballot, will bring legislation to the first meeting in June. This will allow for three readings and to be submitted by the deadline. Mr. Detty discussed three parcels of railroad property in Lawrence County, there are back taxes due. This property is difficult to record, done by a drawing that covers four counties. Ask if there was really any interest in keeping. Mr. Goodman stated that there is no track in Lawrence County. Mr. Eric Brown asked if we were not receiving rent, why we have to pay taxes. Mr. Detty stated that argument could be made, will look at all possibilities. Mr. Detty stated that he was pleased with the efforts to keep outside legal fees at a minimum; this is controlled now through a line item in his budget. Stating in 2007 spent \$173,000, 2008 spent \$68,000 and in 2009 just under \$40,000 spent. His office will continue to watch and work with the budget and finance committee in order to work properly. Mr. Detty stated that in 2008, Ordinance No. 35-08 was passed to hire Mr. Martin, Esq. on an as needed basis, mainly working on the City v. US Rail suit. If any member has questions please call or stop by, Monday and Tuesday are not good days; He requested an executive session to discuss City v. US Rail. Mr. Brown asked if Ordinance No. 35-08 had an expiration date. Mr. Detty stated he will check. Mr. Speakman passed the cemetery levy over to the Service Committee.

MAYOR

Mayor Heath welcomed the new and returning members. He had passed out Mr. Woltz's contract and a detailed memo attached. This contract contains no increase for the next three years unless other unions receive an increase. This would set the direction of the city contracts. Mayor Heath stated he had appointed Carol Downton to replace Jane Kidd on the Board of Health. He stated that Westview students will be going door to door in the near future to promote recycling. Mrs. Attwood has passed out a new recycling schedule for 2010, we currently have 850 participants. The administration is currently working on the 5 year comprehensive plan. Will present the State of the City address at the next meeting. Thanked the employees for there efforts last week.

Mrs. Colby asked if Mr. Woltz's contract should be discussed in public or executive session. Mr. Detty stated in open session if Mr. Woltz has no objections. He did not. Mrs. Colby read a letter and the amendment from 2006. Mayor Heath stated he had no idea, he had followed the opinion of the law director in 2008, Mrs. Colby stated that he and Mr. Brown were both on council in 2006 when he was employed with a two year contract. In 2006 Mr. Humphreys notified within the 180 days, he also notified the law director. Mayor Goodman presented a four year contract, there was a lot of discussion and it was amended. Mr. Heath presented the amended with a 20 month contract. The contract went into effect without the amendment. In 2006, Mr. Goodman and Mr. Woltz signed the contract without the amendment, the auditor questioned and the administration told him to proceed without the amendment. Mayor Heath stated he could not answer, as I was not the Mayor at that time. Mrs. Colby stated council passed, not one time did anyone bring this to their attention. Mr. Woltz turned in comp time and overtime. Mr. Smith asked for clarification, council amended and the mayor rejected. Mr. Detty stated he could not answer as to why this happened. Mr. Detty stated this happened in 2008, for 18 months as signed. There was a committee appointed to negotiate, as for notice of the meetings, when and where, there is no documentation. The contract probably should have been changed, but wasn't. We should look at how not to let this type of thing happen again. Contracts should be prepared by or viewed by my office. This could be done before they are signed and avoid this type of action. Mr. Smith asked does the Mayor have obligation to follow addendums by council or is it the Mayor's choice, and I'm not pointing fingers. Mr. Detty stated should follow amendments. Mrs. Colby stated that Ordinance 74-06 has the amendment attached in the records and on the website, the minutes reflect this. Mr. Speakman stated that Mrs. Colby had the floor for ten minutes any additional time would have to be done so by motion. Mr. Smith made a motion to allow Mrs. Colby additional time to speak on the contract, seconded by Mr. Fain. In a roll call vote, all council agreed. Mrs. Colby read the minutes from May 22, 2006 and discussed. She stated that the ordinance was amended, and passed at the next meeting. The auditor had the amendment and the contract was signed. She told Mr. Detty that under law, you are supposed to do all contracts, you took the minutes, had the ordinance and amendment. You should have told us, some one done this, council was never notified. The Mayor only executes, council has the right to change. Mr. Brown stated he remembers the committee, but he feels Mr. Woltz is an asset. The amendment was not signed and did not go into effect; it could have expired in December. Mayor Heath thanked Mrs. Colby for the history lesson, stating that was 2006 it is now 2010, and he feels he is an asset to the city; he has done far more than just an IT director. He performed as acting Service/Safety Director at no additional expense; prepared numbers needed for the utilities, the city cannot wait days for a technician to correct problems. There were issues in 2006, in 2010 we have a valuable employee, a valid contract with no increase, this was very admirable, and we need to move forward. Mr. Smith agreed to move forward the past is the past, there were lots of issues. It is fruitless to point fingers; we need to move forward, as a council, and would like to see a contract by the next meeting. Mr. Woltz asked if his current contract was not valid. Mr. Speakman stated if any member of council would like to file suit in Common Pleas Court they could do so if they did not like Mr. Detty's opinion. Mrs. Colby stated this is a sad situation; this would be paid with city funds. He has been paid more than we approved and if the majority of council wishes, we have the right to outside council. Mr. Humphreys stated he was not the

Auditor at the time this all took place, as president of council at the time; his opinion is that the ordinance would not have passed without the amendments. He stated that in 2006 the auditor did question and told to set aside by the administration, it was to terminate in 2008, but the Mayor, Service Director and Mr. Detty came to the conclusion and decision to continue to pay. Mr. Elliott asked if we assume it expired, are we operating under a different contract. Mr. Detty stated he continued to work; it's kind of like a rental. Mr. Elliott stated both sides agreed some type of contract in place. Mrs. Colby stated Ordinance 72-06, council passed with amendment, Mayor and Mr. Woltz did not sign, this did not exist, as far as she is concerned this is null, it terminated in 2008. Mr. Humphreys stated the state auditors have no finding, they did not review. Mrs. Sexton stated they do not look at everything. Mr. Speakman stated this information was from the Athens office. Mr. Humphreys called, told plain and simple last week to continue to pay until council takes other action. Mr. Woltz asked if he should show up tomorrow. Mayor Heath told him to be here. Mr. Smith asked about the contract. Mayor Heath stated this would amend the contract that is in place. Mr. Smith stated goes by the contract. Mr. Detty stated it is valid through 2010. Mr. Brown stated the law director's opinion is final, as is or make amendment. Mr. Sheward stated we were to give notice within 180 days if we were not going to renew, a new contract will start in July. Mrs. Colby stated the state auditor says we can get a second opinion. Mr. Fain asked if this needed done tonight. Mayor Heath stated no, think about and we discuss, this reduces his pay increases, it will be valid all parties will sign off.

Mrs. Colby made a motion to obtain an outside opinion, seconded by Mr. Powell. In a roll call vote, council voted as follows:

Motion failed.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR

He stated that there has been good progress made on the spur repair, they have moved a lot of dirt, the cold temperatures have aided in this. The fact finding has been postponed by the FOP.

REPORT OF THE LAW DIRECTOR

The following is the Report of the Law Director:

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS - NOTES

• Ordinance No, 1-10 was prepared at the request of Council Member Fain. I assume he may wish to comment on this ordinance when it is presented.

OPEN MEETING LAWS/CONFLICTS

- Attached find information concerning the Ohio law for Open Meetings. Each year at the beginning of the year I issue this summary as a reminder to incumbent members and as information for newly elected members.
- Also attached is a summary concerning the law as to unlawful interest in contracts. Again, each year at the first council meeting I issue this summary as a reminder to incumbent members and information for newly elected members.
- If at any time you have any questions please feel free to contact me and we can discuss the issue.

RENTS AND RIGHT OF WAYS

- Late Monday afternoon (January 11, 2010) I received a letter from the Ohio Auditor of State's Office in response to the City's proposed rents and right of ways that was passed by council last year.
- Due to receiving this letter so late I have not yet had an opportunity to review and analyze the response.
- I will make a report on this at the January 25, 2010 meeting.

• CEMETERY LEVY

- The cemetery levy will need to be addressed this year.
- We will collect money under the current levy through 2011.
- To make sure we meet the time requirements and give the issue the best possible chance I would suggest we put it on the ballot at the earliest possible time, which would be the November 2010 election. If it fails during that election that still gives us two more opportunities to being it to a vote in 2011 before it would expire.
- I will prepare the resolution for presentation at the first meeting in June, so it can go through three readings and still take effect before the middle of August.
- The last levy was a replacement levy. You will need to give some thought as to whether you will want to place the levy on the ballot as a replacement or a renewal. A replacement could change the amount of taxes as it will be based on current taxation values. A renewal means it will continue as is with no increase or change.
- Just wanted to make you aware of this issue so I can get some direction and guidance in advance.

RAILROAD PROPERTY TAXES

- Last week we received notice from the Lawrence County Auditor that apparently there are past sue and delinquent taxes on railroad property located in Lawrence County.
- Apparently when the original deed was prepared some parcels were not transferred. In fact it was only last week that CSX made the transfers.
- At this time we are not sure where the old tax duplicates/bills were sent.
- The original deed for the railroad was unique in that there was no specific descriptions. This made it extremely difficult to get all the parcels transferred. It was believed, after negotiations with all the County Auditors involved, that all parcels were transferred to their satisfaction. Apparently three small parcels in Lawrence County were not transferred.
- This issue is not any blame to US Rail. The amount due is in excess of \$8,000.00.
- We believe the parcels involved have no rail on them, are not used for railroad purposes, and are dead end spurs. We intend to verify this.
- In the event the property involved is not presently used for rail purposes, and there is no reasonable belief to believe the property will be used for railroad purposes, perhaps the property could go to a tax sale to satisfy the delinquency.
- We will update Council at future meetings on this matter.

OUTSIDE COUNSEL FEES

- Outside Counsel Fees:
 - Prior to 2008 the City was paying outside attorneys an enormous amount of money. This was a big part of the budgets, and there was no oversight or control over the use of outside counsel.
 - Any member of the administration or any council member could and did contact outside counsel on a regular basis. This was costing the City upwards of \$200 per hour.
 - In 2007 outside counsel fees were in excess of \$173,000.
 - In years prior to 2007 the annual expense was even greater.
 - In 2008 when the last council took office I requested that outside counsel fees be placed in the Law Director's Budget, and that the Law Director be the responsible person for outside counsel.
 - I appreciate City Council making this change and placing the responsibility of this upon my office.
 - As a result of this change costs for outside counsel have been greatly reduced.
 - In 2008 this amount decreased to \$68,000. (Over \$50,000 of this was to Columbus attorneys who were still under contract.)
 - o 2009 Outside Counsel Fees in 2009 were \$39,856.87.
- Attorney William C. Martin:
 - Per Ordinance 35-08, passed on March 24, 2008, the City Law Director was authorized to hire local attorney William Martin on an as needed basis for outside counsel assistance.
 - o I believe costs have been held to a minimum.
 - Presently Mr. Martin's main emphasis is assisting with the <u>City of</u> Jackson v U.S. Rail matter.
 - o I would request that Council allow this arrangement to continue.
- I will continue to closely monitor the Law Director's budget as to outside counsel and will continue to strive to use the City's resources wisely.
- The Law Director's Office is proud of the savings that have been realized to this City as a result of the change that placed oversight of outside counsel with the Law Director. Just from 2008 to the present these expenses have decreased by over \$120,000 per year.

OPEN DOOR/OPEN COMMUNICATION

- As Law Director I strive to keep an open door policy in meeting with council members or administration officials.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

• I would request an executive session to discuss and update you on the pending litigation of *City of Jackson v U.S. Rail*.

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EXPLANATION OF TOM WOLTZ CONTRACT

January 7, 2010

Dear City Council members,

One of the items I will be addressing in my report Monday night deals with the contract the city has with Tom Woltz.

Tom Woltz was hired by a contract approved by City Council on June 29, 2004. A new four-year agreement took effect in July, 2006. Council did pass some amendments at the time in 2006, one amendment stating the contract would end on Feb. 28, 2008.

Those amendments, though, never took effect. The administration addressed this issue with Law Director Jack Detty in late February, 2008, and his opinion that the amendments were never in effect is included.

Mr. Woltz's current contract, thus, ends in July, 2010, but if the contract was to be terminated, notification was necessary prior to January 3, 2010. Since notification was not made, his new contract will automatically take effect in July, 2010.

Mr. Woltz and the administration had been discussing the financial terms of the contract, since the administration had every intention of seeing the contract continue and not terminating Mr. Woltz's services.

The current contract calls for a 3.5 percent annual pay increase, and it was Mr. Woltz who first approached the administration suggesting he forego his scheduled pay increase in 2010 because of the financial struggles our city is facing.

Ultimately, we are presenting tonight an amendment to the contract which calls for no increase for Mr. Woltz for 2010 and any increase for the remainder of the contract based on the average of any increases granted to the other three unions from their contracts.

In other words, if no union in the city gets a raise in a particular year, Mr. Woltz does not receive one either. I believe this to be the fairest manner in which to handle this. I believe this much better reflects the direction we wish to go as far as employee salaries and helps establish that position.

Briefly commenting on Mr. Woltz's job performance, he has become a most valuable employee to this city because of the diversity he brings to his position. Although employed as an IT director, his responsibilities have grown to include many more critical duties, especially regarding our utility operations.

There are also many jobs Mr. Woltz performs in which he is the only person within our employment with the expertise to perform these duties. Without him, we would have to outsource much of this work at possibly a greater cost, and more importantly, possibly not have the services available when they were critically needed.

While I fully realize a reduction in force might very well be needed this year within our city, any reduction in force must be done responsibly by reviewing each position to see what positions could be eliminated and have the least negative effect on the services we provide our citizens.

Last year, Mr. Woltz might very well have been the most valuable employee our citizens had because of the diversity of his skills and the ability he displayed in handling them. If there is to be a reduction in force, this is an area the administration feels, for the welfare of our citizens, needs to be left intact but with the adjustments we are recommending.

In addition, because of his value, the administration felt it was best to address the issues we had in the contract by amendments rather than having a long, drawn-out negotiation from scratch that could have resulted in the citizens either having to increase the amount we paid Mr. Woltz for his services or losing the services of Mr. Woltz altogether through just arbitrarily terminating his contract without an adequate and/or responsible discussion on the matter.

As hopefully you all know, our critical area of funding lies in the area of the general fund, and because Mr. Woltz probably spends 80 to 90 percent of his time with utility matters, his costs should be primarily allocated to the utility departments and thus, his position has little effect on the funding levels of the general fund.

In other words, if we were to eliminate Mr. Woltz's position, it would not offset having to make any potential reductions in the general fund, meaning eliminating Mr. Woltz's job would not, for instance, save the position of a police officer.

Thus, I hope you will approve this amendment to Mr. Woltz's contract so to help reduce the cost to our citizens.

Dear Mayor Heath:

Pursuant to your request I have reviewed the contract the City presently has with Tom Woltz, IT Director. As part of my investigation I have also made inquiries to the City Auditor's Office concerning the past practices on this contract.

When the agreement was being considered by City Council a motion was made and passed to delete all overtime and compensation time, to make the pay increase 3%, and to have the contract run from July 1, 2006 through February 29, 2008. When the contract was signed by then Mayor Goodman, none of the changes were inserted or included in the executed agreement. Apparently the City Auditor's office did obtain a document titled "WOLTZ CONTRACT AMENDMENTS" and attached this to the signed agreement. This attachment, which was not independently signed or executed, contained the amendments which were made and passed by City Council.

The agreement was executed by Mr. Woltz and Mayor Goodman on July 1, 2006. Since that time Mr. Woltz has performed the duties required of him in the agreement. From information I have received from Barbara Benson in the City Auditor's office, Mr. Woltz received a 3.5% increase in his pay on July 1, 2007. Also, since the execution of the agreement on July 1, 2006, Mr. Woltz has received and been paid time and a half for overtime and compensation time.

A contract requires that the parties have a meeting of the mind. Contracts can be oral or written, and contract can be modified. In the present case, although there were amendments ordered by City Council, by the actions of the parties they have apparently decided to forego the amendments by recommended and passed by City Council and

proceed with the contract that was signed and executed by the parties. Mr. Woltz has received the 3.5% pay increase, not a 3% increase. Mr. Woltz has also been compensated at time and a half for overtime and compensation since the agreement was signed. By the actions of the parties have had a meeting of the minds and it would appear that the agreement would be as it is written in the executed agreement.

I do not see how the City, by their actions, can argue that the agreement was to be a 3.5% increase and he was to receive time and a half for overtime and compensation time (both of which have happened) and then terminate the agreement on the basis of the attached, unexecuted document.

It is my opinion, based upon the actions of the parties, that the Woltz contract is in effect until July 1, 2010. The contract will renew automatically for a four (4) year period unless written notice is provided in accordance with the contract at least 180 days prior to the expiration of the agreement.

Had the City brought an action earlier, an argument may have been made that the previous Mayor entered into an unauthorized contract. However, the actions of the City and Mr. Woltz since the execution of the agreement indicate that the parties did have a meeting of the minds and the agreement is the one that was executed, and does not include the amendments.

Hopefully this information will be of assistance to you.
