Regular Session

Jackson City Council met in regular session on Monday, November 8, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. at the Jackson City Council chambers. President Ron Speakman called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was given, led by Mr. Elliott. The Prayer was given, led by Mr. Powell.

Boy Scout Troop #48, Mr. Bowman stated the troop was working on their service merit badges. Mr. Adams remembered when Mr. Bowman brought him to a council meeting over thirty years ago. Mr. Humphreys reminded the community of the Scouting for Food on Saturday.

UTILITY – No Report

BUDGET & FINANCE – No Report

POLICE, FIRE & TRAFFIC

Mr. Smith reported that committee met on November 1st to discuss junk cars, lack of enforcement, the citizens have spoke and ask the Mayor to have police to enforce. The intersection of State and High Streets, this too was passed to the administration. Speeding on Burlington, this too is an enforcement issue. The intersection at Burlington and South, citizens complaining. FOP building rentals, nuisance calls. The speed trailer is down; the Mayor will address this issue. Mr. Sheward stated he passed out Police and Fire reports, see attached. The matter of High Street, parking on both sides, he went and viewed today when the buses were on route, it was wide open, hard to imagine a problem even on the hills. This is not a source of concern with the schools, will keep an eye on for a real issue. The South and Burlington intersection, police ran an accident report, 2003 to date there have been 8 accidents, not sure if any resulted in injury. Just a fact, there were 10 accidents at the light on Burlington and Huron streets during that same period. The possible solutions are take out three trees to the left, paint lanes and no parking. Or four way stop signs with flashing red light, approximate cost is \$1790. These are two options that are realistic. Does council want to input or let the administration deal with it? Letters have been sent in regards to the junk cars, they will have 14 days to respond. But we have no money to tow cars, this is an emergency. Mr. Elliott asks about removing the flashing light at Star and Huron, it's an unnecessary light. Mr. Sheward stated when people get used to the four way, the lights can be removed. Mr. Elliott questioned why that was a four way. Mayor Heath stated there were a couple of accidents, children and bikes. Mr. Speakman stated the accidents increased for a period after the four way was installed, just warned to be careful in installing. Mrs. Colby stated the neighbors requested. Mr. Smith stated if we have no money for towing, why are we discussing, folks are concerned, and we need to approach getting the funds. Mayor Heath stated he spoke with Chief Eisnagle; some cars may not meet the criteria. Mr. Powell asked if we were citing people before towing. Mayor Heath stated they must be notified 14 days before taking action. Mrs. Colby stated if the tags are expired, send a letter and have towed. Mr. Sheward stated no tags alone is not enough, they must meet 3 out 5, three have been moved or removed, but we have four new ones, we are working on them, just please pass the ordinance.

SERVICE – No Report

Mr. Elliott thanked the citizens for the cemetery levy passage.

RAILROAD

Mr. Smith stated that US Rail are delinquent for the months of March and September, according to the Auditor. Mr. Fain asked if letters had been sent. Mr. Detty replied yes. Mayor Heath reported they were also late on the real estate tax payments.

BUILDING/RECREATION – No Report

CITY AUDITOR

Mr. Humphreys reported on the post audit conference held last Wednesday, Mayor Heath, Mr. Sheward, Mrs. Colby and the Auditor and staff were present. Clean audit, no findings. The findings from the year before had been collected. Mayor Heath stated this is very pleasing, and they noted a favorable response on the fund balances for utilities; they were healthy for future expansion.

LAW DIRECTOR

Mr. Detty gave his report, see attached. Mr. Adams asked about the tax collections. Mr. Detty stated he is working with the prosecutor. The intern left after two weeks, we are progressing. Mr. Fain asked about the painting at Landrum's. Mr. Detty stated a letter had been sent.

MAYOR

Mayor Heath expressed his sincere appreciation of the levy passage, Mr. Fain had written a letter in support. The actions of those who keep the cemetery spoke for us, thanked Mr. Rasp, Mr. Henderson, Mr. Woods, and Mrs. Palletti. Requested that Mr. Eisnagle track officer's time, get a better handle of time spent on reports/calls. Discussed the pride of our community, by the number of people who traveled to Eaton for the playoffs, we had as many people as them.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR

Mr. Sheward discussed problems with Circuit #4 electric service; it shuts down the radio station. This was the longest circuit in the city, intermittent problems, could be birds, insulator fracture, arcs. This has been discussed with Mr. Fisher, they are looking closely, divided in half, maybe we can isolate. There are a lot of dead starlings; this may be part of the problem. Mr. Fisher has met with the radio, now on a different circuit, it resets itself and we can't find the problem, full time effort to resolve.


NEW BUSINESS



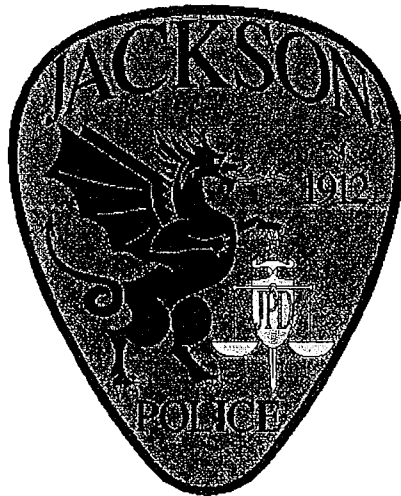
