Regular Session

Jackson City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 14, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at the Jackson City Council chambers. President Ronald Speakman called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was given, led by Mr. Foster. The Prayer was given, led by Mr. Brown.

A roll call was taken as follows:

Mr. Elliott made a motion to approve the minutes from April 23, 2012 regular session, seconded by Mr. Queen. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

VISITORS

Mr. Harold Howe stated he appreciated being on the agenda he was here as a resident. On May 10, 2011 and May 4, 2012 the property he owns was flooded. He has been visited by the administration and staff in regards to this issue. Further stating he had been in the epicenter saw things, some the same, some worse. Just here to ask about creek cleaning, contacting the Army Corp of Engineers, there is not one answer. He had 20 units flooded, same as in 2011. He is just looking for relief, clean or dredge the creeks, this may alleviate some issues, and some apartments only had an inch of water. Looking toward the future, hoping for a response and feedback. He does have some ideas, can't stop progress, not here to blame or criticize. He would like to work together toward a solution.

Mr. Queen stated he had lived in the flood area for 47 years. Mr. Howe replied that area was not as bad. Mr. Queen stated it is different each time. Mr. Kitchen asks if there was a group that could take a photo of the area. Mr. Howe wasn't sure. Mr. Smith stated it peaked at dark. Mr. Speakman stated there was no water in the field on 139. Mr. Howe stated that the Steve Reigel and the Mayor stopped by today. The creeks were cleaned two years ago, mud has settled, something is causing the backup. This is a priority, it only gets worse, hope you look at and come up with a game plan. Mr. Speakman appointed to the Service Committee, Mr. Elliott, Mr. Foster and Mrs. Jones.

Mayor Heath stated he had spoken with ODJFS in regards to Mr. Sexton and asks to extend this program into the city; they will have an answer in thirty days. Mr. Smith stated a lot of flooding in the 1st ward, discussed this when Cary Brown was here, the culvert at Manpower, other areas that need to be looked at, this has caused a lot of problems. JHS sits on a hill, and is a problem. The water will find a way out. Small businesses can't keep rebuilding, the park is still flooded. We need to look at solutions, increase the size of the tributaries; we are without proper curbing so it follows the street. Mayor Heath stated he wanted nothing more than to find a solution.

MAYOR

Mayor Heath stated last Thursday he met with ORDRC, both committee and regular meetings, we will be receiving \$225,000 grant for bridge repairs between Jackson and Coalton. Working with US Rail on contract negotiations, waiting on information, no timetable. The summer recreation, if we can dodge raindrops will start baseball next week; the pool will open next Saturday. Mr. Queen asked if there would be another clean up week, it rained that day. Mr. Sheward stated that was done by the county. Mayor Heath stated he will contact the Health Department. Mr. Queen asked what the \$20,000 to Rumpke was for. Mayor Heath replied landfill fees. Mr. Queen asked about the Filling Station. Mr. Sheward stated that was for the rest of the year.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR

Mr. Sheward stated he received a letter with drawing from the Garden Lover's Club for McKinnley Park over by South Street and Columbia Street; this was dedicated November 20, 1901. They plan and have started planting trees, benches, trash containers. They put the cart before the horse, would recommend granting. Mr. Brown made a motion to allow, seconded by Mr. Elliott. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

Mr. Sheward stated he received an email from Nea requesting a sewer connection on SR 93, city sewer is available, and the house is outside the city. Mr. Brown asks if this was residential. Mr. Sheward replied yes. Mr. Kitchen made a motion to grant, seconded by Mr. Brown. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

Mr. Sheward stated he is seeking permission to apply for grants for the police department. \$6800, OAG office, this is for programs in the school, 30% can go toward the school resource officer.

Mr. Sheward discussed the reports from the Police and Fire departments see attached. Mr. Queen stated that the Diamond area needs the bridge fixed for road traffic. Mr. Sheward stated repairs cannot be made. Mr. Queen stated anything can be done, asking what other members thought. Mr. Smith stated that bridge has been closed for 30 years. Mr. Queen stated it was used 10 years ago. Mr. Sheward stated he was concerned with it being used as a walkway. Mr. Kitchen stated he looked at the bridge, there is enough steel and concrete to hold a freight train, needs inspected. Mr. Smith stated council should not be bridge experts, why keep it up if it is only used every 10 years. Mr. Kitchen stated it could cost someone's life. Mr. Smith replied not to downplay, but you can't get down Huron either. Mr. Speakman forwarded this to the committee also.
