UTILITY - No Report

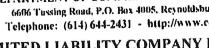

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Council President Ron Speakman;

This letter is to request that Council take a look at what the position of city treasurer is paid; and that at the end of Dec. 2013, the position has not had a raise in 8 years. If no action is taken, the position will go 12 years with no increase.

With this in mind; the position currently pays \$7200.00 a year with no benefits what so ever other than PERS. The Treasurer is paid once a month, 12 times a year. City employees are paid 26 times a year, the position of treasurer is screwed out of 4 weeks pay. The duties must be completed in a window of 2 ½ hours every week day; between 1pm & 3:30 pm. It takes on an average of 1 ½ hours a day to do this. But, in summer months of June, July, & August can take up to & over 2 hours because of money from city pool & ball field concession stands.

The duties of the office include the following: count, document, & prepare deposit slips for moneys received from the utility office & auditors office; then take this cash & checks to the bank for deposit. Also, to reconcile 10 to 12 accounts once a month, attend about 12 city investment meetings per year. There is a full day Treasures seminar I must attend every year some where in Ohio, up to 2 hours away; this is required by law. The Treasure also makes trips to local banks to make changes in investments of CD's. In the past 3 years I have changed the time slot of making deposits; so we are now doing deposits on a current day basis. This change means that city funds receive interest for that day, not like in the past where it was running a day behind.

So, I am respectfully requesting that city council give the positio of Treasure of the City of Jackson a raise.
