COMMITTEE REPORTS

UTILITY - No Report

Mr. Brown requested from the administration a report on the sewer fund, to see review progress after raising rates.

BUDGET & FINANCE

Mr. Elliott reported trying to find money, can't find any. Couple of plans floated in the past, in regards to creek cleaning and building issues, add a storm water fee at \$2.00 per month, could raise \$80,000 - \$100,000 per year and a police levy, this would free up those funds currently being taken from general fund. Would like to see how serious we are about creek cleaning. Mr. Kitchen asked to keep looking, appreciate efforts.

POLICE, FIRE & TRAFFIC - No Report

SERVICE

Mr. Kitchen thanked Mayor Heath for arranging meeting and openness. Held meeting on July 1st at 7:00, the buildings are in need of repair. Commented on Michael's Building, still working on it, no word or progress. There appears to be another owner, Mary Ball. Followed up with Health Department, funds had been requested from commissioners to tear down. Basically, if they have money to do. Health Department has records for the past six years of what buildings are looked at and what has been done. Impressed with Health Department, book was provided, good information. Will schedule another meeting. Met on July 2nd at 7:00 p.m., discussed cemetery, Anthony Coyan gave description of work through Genealogical Society, working on map, from a Veteran's stand point. Would like some help from local Veteran's groups with cost of signs, the cost is not yet fully determined. In regards to the creek, Shawn Sexton spoke on creek cleaning and maintenance, approximately 7 miles, all accessible with truck or 4x4. Pointed out proper equipment is critical, track hoe, track mower, dump truck, important to consider, removed tons of debris. Pick up on regular basis, must be done, best time is late September, early October. Not sure of mowing schedule, mowing is required. Estimated cost to clean \$187,000. There is a complete list of owners, city owns 2/3. There were 4 visitors; last 15 minutes were for them to speak. All members were

present and allowed to address, very productive. There are government ¾ ton surplus vehicles, rather plentiful. Ron knows how to get. Appreciate the meeting, free exchange of ideas, almost complete cooperation.

Mr. Smith reminded everyone that a meeting is scheduled for July 10th at 7:00 p.m.

CITY AUDITOR

Mr. Reed reported Audit 2012, done in record time, cleanest audit on record, no administrative letter.

LAW DIRECTOR

Mr. Kirby stated he would answer any questions in regards to the letter provided, see attached.

MAYOR

Mayor Heath reported an enjoyable July 4th celebration, thanked the Jaycees, Chamber, there was a parade, 5K, concert, there were approximately 200 runners. Thankful no storm. Thanked Mr. Kitchen for his kind words, both meetings informative. Thanked Mr. Sexton, stating the meeting on Wednesday was very informative. Met with ODOT District 9 to discuss street repaving, Mr. Foster was present, very expensive programs, 20% matching, continuing to keep community neat, some curb painting being done.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR

Mr. Sheward reported water plant is connected to city power, except some fiber optic for communication, very few problems. Mosquito spraying will be July 15th or 16th depending on rain. Tonight will be second reading on ordinance for Knox box, and Ordinance 31-13, additional appropriations for police physicals, not done for several years, requirement. Just so council is aware, ¾ of funds for jail expenses have been used; don't be surprised when we are out of money, female, ton of people in jail. Both male and female, back in realm of transportation. Mr. Brown asked about status of contract negotiations. Mr. Sheward stated July. Mr. Brown asked can we see existing contracts, are you still open for ideas. Mr. Sheward replied of course, please ask for copy. Mr. Brown replied I want a copy. Mr. Reed said he can scan and email. Mr. Sheward stated yes, we have in that form. Mr. Queen also requested a copy. Mr. Kitchen asked Mr. Sheward about construction work outside chambers. Mr. Sheward replied don't know, pay contract amount, generator delivered next week, large generator to operate this building. Command center goes out when we lose power; this is part of feed one project. Mr. Queen asked how many people the jail will hold. Mayor Heath replied 40 beds when built, we get 7 beds at all times, our beds are full, no space available. Mr. Queen asked wasn't it suppose to be a 2 story jail. Mayor Heath stated it would not meet requirements for that.

Dear Council Members, Mayor and Service Director;

I have met with the administration and others concerning issues related to abandoned, run down or unsafe buildings within the City of Jackson and the different options that exist to address the problems created by those buildings. The City does have ordinances in place to address health and safety concerns. Issues regarding non-health and safety matters that are more of an "appearance" nature may not fall within the remedies in the City code. The following is a summary of the options available as found in the City code governing buildings, litter, and sanitary sewer hook-ups.

Unsafe buildings are defined as those buildings that fall within the following categories:

- Structurally unsafe;
- inadequate egress or which constitute a fire hazard;
- otherwise dangerous to human life;
- or, constitute a hazard to health by reason of inadequate maintenance, dilapidation or obsolescence, in relation to existing use.

The City Code states that the Service Director shall examine each building or structure that is reported as or believed to be unsafe. If the building meets the requirement of unsafe by virtue of any of those hazards listed above, then the owner may be issued a citation. That citation shall specifically state the defects that cause the building to be unsafe. The citation also requires the work shall commence within thirty days to remedy the condition. There is not a specific time limit by which the repairs must be completed. However, the notice of demolition procedure does anticipate the Service Director setting a time limit for the repairs in the notice as part of the demolition procedure (1323.06).

If the owner fails to remedy the situation then the City may proceed towards condemnation proceedings. If, upon receiving citation, the owner objects, he may request a hearing within ten days. If, after any requested hearings, the hazardous conditions have not been

corrected, the property may be demolished. The owner may be subject to criminal penalties of a misdemeanor of the 4th degree for failure to comply with the notice of demolition proceeding.

The City Code requires that "The cost of the demolition work shall be paid by the City." The City can, however, seek reimbursement. The Ohio Revised Code, R.C. Section 715.261, sets forth two methods to seek reimbursement. The first is to, within one year of the demolition, have the City Clerk certify the cost of the demolition to the County Auditor to be placed as a special assessment on the property. The property could then be sold. Such sale would include payment of this lien and real estate taxes. The second method is to file a civil action. That would be a civil suit against the land owner for reimbursement of the cost of demolition. Any judgment would be a civil judgment and subject to collection by any of the available civil means. This would include garnishment, execution on personal property, etc.

The City may review properties for litter issues. It is a violation of the City Code to allow litter to be deposited on any occupied private property within the City or vacant property. Litter includes garbage, refuge, rubbish and all other waste material, more fully defined by Jackson City Code 559.02. A littering violation constitutes a minor misdemeanor for each day that such violation is committed or permitted to continue. The City also has the option to remove the litter. Prior to doing so, the Service Director shall notify the owner of the condition and allow the owner five days from the date of receipt of the notice to clear the litter. Failure to do so will permit the City to remove the litter. The City may bill its actual costs incurred in the removal plus 6% per year. Again the costs for removal can be collected by making the costs a special assessment on the real estate tax duplicate or by civil action.

Also, Jackson City Code Section 1313.04 provides that each building shall connect to the sewer main in accordance with the ordinance's rule and regulations of the City. Failure to maintain such a connection can carry criminal penalties.
