The liner is about 25 years old and is in bad shape. Mayor Heath said they are getting prices on a liner. He also wanted to remind everyone one a part of Huron St. is closed by the pool. The pool can be accessed from the East side. They are also going to try to make a path to walk up to the pool.

Mr. Kitchen asked that the benches in Manpower Park be replaced. Mayor Heath and Mr. Sheward said they will take care of it.

LAW DIRECTOR

Mr. Kirby said everyone should have multiple revisions of the tax code.

Mr. Queen said the house at 102 Logan St. burned recently. Mr. Kirby said he will send out a notice to the property owners that it needs torn town. Mr. Queen said they might also want to check the power lines to make sure they weren't damaged.

Mr. Kitchen asked if he had heard anymore about the gas station at the corner of Morton and Chillicothe Streets and Mr. Kirby stated it is in foreclosure. He thinks it is set for sale, but he will check.

MAYOR

Mayor Heath stated there are 3 ordinances being given a third reading tonight for the electric upgrade. He would appreciate council voting it through. It is imperative to have this to attract new businesses to Jackson. It will serve as help in the leveling out of distribution and also as a backup should the power be disrupted. They have saved about half of the cost and the other half can be borrowed at a very low interest rate. According to a Columbus Dispatch survey, our rates are still lower than AEP by about 13% and Buckeye Rural by about 19%.

Mayor Heath wished everyone a safe and happy July 4th. The Community Patriotic concert will be held Sunday at 3:00 at the Markay. The parade will be Sunday at 8:00 p.m. The fireworks will be at 10:00 p.m. Sunday and there will be a 5K run Monday morning.

Mr. Kitchen stated there was a Civil War training camp located here called Camp Diamond. They excelled when they went off to battle. The American Legion received a historical marker and it will be dedicated on July 4th at 10:00 a.m. at the Veteran's Park.

SERVICE DIRECTOR

Mr. Sheward said Dickason Street bridge is open and they started on Huron Street bridge today. It should take approximately 45 days to complete.

The fireworks will be set off at about 10:00 p.m. Sunday, July 3rd.
