A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF JACKSON TO FILE AN APPLICATION TO O.P.W.C. DISTRICT 15 ROUND 33 GRANT FUNDING FOR A PROJECT TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY POWER TO ALL WASTEWATER LIFT STATIONS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
WHEREAS, the City desires to make an application to the O.P.W.C. District 15 Round 33 Grant Funding for funding of \$300,000 for a project to provide emergency power to all wastewater lift stations operated by the City; and
WHEREAS, this matter constitutes an emergency as there is an application deadline for the funds requested. This matter constitutes an emergency so as to increase the likelihood that funds will be awarded to the City and such an award shall benefit the health, safety and welfare of the City of Jackson and its citizens; and, therefore:
Section One. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application as set forth above for the maximum funds available to be used for the purchase of the grant eligible equipment for the Fire Department. Show intent of coccacil.
Section Two. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency Resolution, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, and for the reason that the application must be made at the earliest possible date. Therefore, this Resolution shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.
Section Three. In the event this Resolution receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Resolution shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.
It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
