Jackson City Council met in Regular session on Monday, August 12, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in Jackson City Council Chambers. President, Eric Brown called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Queen, and the prayer was given by Mr. Ondera. Roll call was taken as follows:

VISITORS- Engineers from ODOT were present to present us with plans for possible road projects over the next couple of years. Patricia Wetzel, Jenny Barnes, and Jonas Barnes are all from District 9 which oversees 8 counties. One of which is Jackson.

The first project discussed was paving SR 93 beginning at Hwy 32 and running north for a total of 2.12 miles. It would be a 1 ½' mill & fill, working at night only, finishing in 2021.

The second project would beginning at Hwy 32 going south to Four Mile Rd also with 1 ½ 'mill & fill. It was brought to the attention of the engineers that a great portion of that road is not in the city limits. They said they would need to take a closer look to see how much is in the city limits in order to determine the city's matching funds.

The third project discussed was for safety. It is for a new configuration on SR 93 at the intersection of McCarty lane and also the intersection of Anderson Dr. The road coming from McCarty Lane would be altered curving to the left, then going straight across to Anderson Dr., and having only one stop light.

Mr. Queen asked if the lights on the other side of town could be altered, because they too have two sets of lights and are very confusing. The engineers said they did look at that, and there would be signal upgrades and timing related improvements, but not a new corridor. ODOT does pay 100% of the safety projects if their projects are applied for and get approved.

Mr. Brown asked if we can't pay our matching funds what happens? The engineers said they can look at splitting up the projects into smaller segments and stretching them out over a longer time period. Mr. Peters asked about the revenue that we should be getting from the gas tax. Could that money be used for this? The mayor asked Mr. Reed how much money is in account 228. Mr. Reed said there is \$220,000 each year and some of that could be used. Tom Woltz said he needs to know the deadlines for applying for these so that he can look at our other projects and see if we can make this work.

Megan Peters, an attendee at the meeting, spoke up saying as a mayor candidate, she felt it was irresponsible of all of the people to be making these decisions for the city who wouldn't be there much longer. She said only one person is returning as a councilman, and it is irresponsible for the rest of council to decide things for the city when they won't be on council much longer.

Mayor Heath spoke up saying it is their responsibility until December 31st to make decisions and act in the best interest of the city of Jackson.

Eddie Jones Park on Harding looks really nice. The city would like to cut paths for bases so there is a place for teams to play. There just isn't a recreation budget allowing them to do much work.
