Jackson City Council met in Special session on Wednesday, May 15, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in Jackson City Council Chambers. President Eric Brown called the meeting to order. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Elliott. Prayer was given by Mr. Brown.

ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

ORDINANCE NO. 19-19 (AMENDED)

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF SAFETY AND SERVICE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO 2020 PETERBILT 25 YARD GARBAGE TRUCKS FROM TLG FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$323,268.00 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Sheward said the amended amount did not have the extra \$4,000.00 trade-in included, so the amount needed to be corrected again.

Mr. Elliott made a motion to amend the amount to \$319,268.00, seconded by Mr. Foster. In a voice vote, all members agreed.

Mr. Peters asked if they had checked out used trucks. Mr. Sheward said the used trucks are not very good. Mr. Sheward said the recycling truck could be used as a backup if they didn't do recycling. Mr. Queen asked about refurbished trucks. Mr. Sheward said they are hard to come by. There is enough money in the budget to cover the cost. They should not have to add any money. The cost to rent a truck would be \$6,000 per month, but since they are getting the new trucks from them, it is only costing \$1.00 per month.
