Mr. Coll said he noticed there was not a credit for any portion of taxes paid to any other municipal corporation in this state or elsewhere. Mayor Evans said that is something they plan to look at and revise. In 2018 there was a credit given. They will do some research and see what some other areas around us are doing. We will look at amending this for the next reading with some kind of credit.

Mrs. Biggs asked Mr. Reed if he knew what other municipalities do. He said he knew that Wellston does give a credit, but he doesn't think Oak Hill does. Jackson can pass what they wish; it is up to the other cities to do what they want. Mr. Reed said for anyone who had any questions to get them to him and he will do his best to get answers.

Margaret also addressed the Utility Committee. She said she would like to see a work group and everyone work together. Like for them to help the renters. There are things procedurally that can be done. Would like for someone to reach out to the Attorney General's office about municipal collections, and see if there is a cost for it.
