

ORDINANCE NO. 100-07

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY TO ACCEPT RESPONSIBLE FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR AWARDDING THE CONTRACT FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT SHADEN SYSTEM TO GRACE CONSTRUCTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO as follows:

Section One. The Mayor or the Service Director is hereby authorized to execute and ratify all contracts for the Water Treatment Plant Shaden System to Grace Construction and shall be held responsible for the amount of Five Hundred Twenty One Thousand and 10/100 dollars (\$521,000.00). This amount shall be paid from line item 410-7510-54005, Utility Distribution Systems.

Section Two. The Mayor or the Service Director is hereby authorized to execute this Contract and any financing documents according to the terms of the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

Section Three. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety of the City of Jackson, in that it is necessary to commence with this project as soon as possible. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section Four. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

Section Five. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, all in compliance with the law.
