ORDINANCE NO. 22-08

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO, AND MAXUIMUS, INC., FOR CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE PREPARATION OF A 2007 AND 2008 COST ALLOCATION PLANS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson is desirous of receiving information concerning its cost allocations for the years 2007 and 2008; and

WHEREAS, Maximus, Inc. is a firm qualifies to provide assistance to the City in establishing a legal and binding cost allocation plan; and

WHEREAS, the City and Maximus, Inc. desire to enter into a contractual relationship whereby Maximus, Inc. can provide assistance to the City in developing a 2007 and 2008 Cost Allocation Plans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section One. The Mayor and/or City Council President is authorized to enter into an Agreement between the City of Jackson, Ohio, and Maximus, Inc., to provide consulting services for the preparation of a 2007 and 2008 Cost Allocation Plans for the City of Jackson, Ohio. A copy of the Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit "A". The cost of this contract shall be in an amount of Nine Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$9,000.00) for each plan year, plus any additional consulting services at a rate of One Hundred Fifty and No/110 Dollars (\$150.00) per hour, and shall be paid from line item 110-7750-53007 - General Fund: General Government Dept: Professional Services.

<u>Section Two.</u> This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety of the City of Jackson, in that it is necessary to enter into this agreement as soon as possible in order to promptly develop the City's Cost Allocation Plans. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

<u>Section Three.</u> In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

<u>Section Four.</u> It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions, were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Dear Ms. Sexton:
