ORDINANCE NO. 61-09

AN ORDINANCE ABOLISHING THE POSITIONS OF FULL TIME RECREATION DIRECTOR AND THE TWO PART TIME ASSISTANT RECREATION DIRECTORS, AND ESTABLISHING THE POSITIONS OF YOUTH BASEBALL PROGRAM COORDINATOR, YOUTH BASEBALL UMPIRE COORDINATOR, AND YOUTH SOFTBALL PROGRAM AND UMPIRE COORDINATOR.

WHEREAS, the City has previously established the position of Full Time Recreation Director, and the position of two part time Assistant Recreation Directors; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed that the positions of Full Time Recreation Director, and the position of two part time Assistant Recreation Directors are no longer needed and those positions can be replaced with the positions of Youth Baseball Program Coordinator, Youth Baseball Umpire Coordinator, and Youth Softball Program and Umpire Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated this change will be a substantial savings to the City of Jackson.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

<u>Section One.</u> Ordinance No. 274-06, and any other ordinances establishing the position of Full Time Recreation Director and the positions of two Part Time Assistant Recreation Directors are hereby revoked, and the positions of Full Time Recreation Director and the positions of two Part Time Assistant Recreation Directors are hereby eliminated.

Section Two. There is hereby established the following positions and pay rates within the City's Recreation Department:
