ORDINANCE NO. 80 -13

AN ORDINANCE REDUCING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE CHIP GRANT FUNDS: HOME BUILDING REPAIR AND DOWN PAYMENT ASSISTANCE REHAB AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section 1: The prior appropriations regarding the fund set forth below is hereby modified so as to reduce the appropriation as follows:

<u>FUND</u>	<u>CATEGORY</u>	<u>AMOUNT</u>
296-7426-53085	Home Building Repair	(\$50,000.00)
296-7426-53086	Down Payment Assistance Rehab	(\$152,000.00)


Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary to reduce earlier appropriations as the anticipated revenue for this fund was not received during the 2013 year. This is an emergency necessary to maintain the public health, safety and welfare so that the appropriate amount of funds will be in this line item for the books to accurately reflect correct balances at the end of the year and not exceed estimated resources.

Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
