ORDINANCE NO. 41-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO TO ACCEPT THE BID OF JONES-STEPHENSON INSURANCE AGENCY FOR PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE CITY OF JACKSON AS IT WAS THE LOWEST AND BEST RESPONSIVE BID SUBMITTED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in response to a request for bids for property and casualty insurance for the City of Jackson, bids have been reviewed and a determination has been made as to the lowest and best responsive bid for insurance coverage for the City of Jackson; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the lowest and best responsive bid was from Jones-Stephenson Insurance of Jackson, Ohio for property and casualty coverage for a rate of \$102,000.00 per year as follows:

Year One (6-25-14 to 6-24-15)	\$102,000.00
Year Two (6-25-15 to 6-24-16)	\$102,000.00
Year Three (6-25-16 to 6-24-17)	<u>\$102,000.00</u>
TOTAL 3 YEAR CONTRACT	\$306,000.00

WHEREAS, the current policy of insurance is set to expire in June, 2014 and this matter constitutes an emergency so as to maintain continuous property and casualty insurance coverage which is necessary for the preservation of the public's health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The legislative authority of the City of Jackson hereby authorizes the Mayor or Director of Service and Public Safety of the City of Jackson, Ohio to accept the bid of property and casualty insurance as submitted by Jones-Stephenson Insurance for a rate of \$102,000.00 per year, guaranteed for three years for a total three year cost of \$306,000.00.

Section 2. This matter is hereby declared to be an emergency necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, Ohio in order to maintain continuous insurance coverage.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.


