ORDINANCE NO. 09-14

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORD. 47-13 REGARDING AN ACCEPTANCE OF A BID FOR THE 13.2kV CIRCUIT 3 AND 3A CONVERSION PROJECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the bid opening for the 13.2kV Circuit 3 and 3A Conversion Project has not resulted in a contract being signed although more than 60 days have passed and there are changes that must be made to the project and which were not included as part of the original bid process; and

WHEREAS, the City reserved the right to reject all bids; and

WHEREAS, ORD 47-13 previously enacted by this legislative authority is hereby repealed in its entirety and is of no further force or effect; and

WHEREAS, this matter constitutes an emergency necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the City so that the project may be re-bid at the earliest possible date.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO THAT ORD. 47-13 BE, AND HEREBY IS, REPEALED ANT THAT IT SHALL HAVE NO FURTHER FORCE OR EFFECT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and the deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
