ORDINANCE NO. 43-15

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE TO THE REIMB. SERVICES & MATERIALS FUND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section 1: The prior appropriations regarding the fund set forth below is hereby modified, based upon recently completed figures that previously were unavailable, so as to appropriate additional money to be used for the Cost Allocation Plan as follows:


Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance so that the funds can be appropriated so that the Cost Allocation Plan can be posted as scheduled which is necessary to preserve the health, safety and welfare of the City and its citizens.

Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.




