ORDINANCE NO. 10 -15

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE HARDING AVENUE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT FUND, THE HURON STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT FUND AND THE McCARTY LANE SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT FUND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section 1: The funds set forth below are hereby created for the receipt of project funds as follows:

- Fund #442: Harding Avenue Bridge Replacement Fund
- Fund #443: Huron Street Bridge Replacement Fund
- Fund #444: McCarty Lane Sanitary Sewer Improvement Fund

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, Ohio as these funds must be established to account for the various upcoming projects pursuant to the individual grant guidelines so that the revenue from grant funds can be posted to the proper fund to be appropriated for expenditure. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
