ORDINANCE NO. 84-15

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE EDWIN JONES FUND AND LILLIAN JONES TRUST FUND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section 1: The prior appropriations regarding the fund set forth below is hereby modified so as to appropriate additional money as follows:



813-7310-56001	Edwin Jones Fund: Transfer Out	\$955.46
814-8420-56001	Lillian Jones Trust Fund: Transfer Out	\$3,081.35

Section 2. This additional appropriation is for interest received in these trust funds so that it can be transferred to their respective operating funds. This should be considered an emergency so that the transfer of total interest received in 2015 can be transferred before year end. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary to maintain the public health, safety and welfare so that appropriations will be in place to post the necessary journal entries before closing the books in 2015. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
