ORDINANCE NO. 01-21

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND AMENDING ORD. 92-99 REGARDING POLICE PERSONNEL AS SET FORTH IN THE CITY OF JACKSON CODIFIED ORDINANCES AS SECTION 131.01.

WHEREAS, ORD 92-99, as contained in Section 131.01 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Jackson, established the personnel for the Jackson Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Jackson has determined it necessary to revise the personnel regarding the Assistant Chief position and to establish the position of a police chaplain as set forth below; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO THAT ORD 92-99 BE AMENDED AND REPEALED AND SECTION 131.01 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON BE AMENDED, AS SET FORTH BELOW WITH THOSE STRUCK THROUGH PORTIONS BEING REMOVED AND REPLACED WITH THE UNDERLINED LANGUAGE SHOWING THE AMENDMENTS TO THE ORIGINAL LANGUAGE AND THAT IT BE REPLACED WITHIN THE JACKSON CITY CODE, IN REGULAR TEXT.

131.01 PERSONNEL.

The Police Department shall be composed of the following officers and other members:

- (a) One Chief.
- (b) One Not to exceed one Assistant Chief.
- (c) Not to exceed five Sergeants.
- (d) Not to exceed fifteen Patrol officers.
- (e) Not to exceed two Secretaries.
- (f) Not to exceed six Dispatchers
- (g) Temporary Police as required.
- (h) Police Chaplain, during such times that the Chief of Police operates the Police Chaplain program, which shall be a volunteer position offered by the Police Chief to an ordained and active or retired minister, rabbi or equivalent, to serve at the discretion of the Chief of Police.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and the deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
