**ORDINANCE 09-21**

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE POSITION OF CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER AND ESTABLISHING SALARY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Jackson, Ohio:

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is responsible for the creation of new positions within the City and setting the compensation of such positions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor has recommended the creation of the new part-time position of Code Enforcement Officer who shall serve as an assistant to the Mayor and the Director of Public Service and Safety and who shall be authorized to act in their place in matters of zoning and enforcement of nuisance violations and shall hold a fiduciary relationship to them; and

**WHEREAS**, the position of Code Enforcement Officer shall be an unclassified service position within the City pursuant to O.R.C. section 124.11(A)(28); and

**WHEREAS**, Council for the City of Jackson desires to create the part-time unclassified position of Code Enforcement Officer.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO:**

**Section 1:** The position of Code Enforcement Officer shall be in the unclassified service of the City and serve at the pleasure of the Mayor, and whose duties shall include all things necessary for enforcement of City code and zoning requirements.

**Section 2:** The annual salary shall be \$20,800 to \$38,000 and shall be paid on a biweekly basis.

**Section 3:** The individual appointed to the position of Code Enforcement Officer will be a part-time position and shall not be entitled to benefits in addition to salary.

**Section 4:** That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure as the position created is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and the safety of the residents of the City of Jackson so that the City may immediately begin the management and enforcement of its zoning code.

In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
