DIRECTOR'S ORDER

In Re: Amended Order to Limit and/or Prohibit Mass Gatherings and the Closure of Venues in the State of Ohio

I, Amy Acton, MD, MPH, Director of the Ohio Department of Health (ODH), pursuant to the authority granted to me in R.C. 3701.13 to "make special orders...for preventing the spread of contagious or infectious diseases" **Order** the following to prevent the spread of COVID-19 into the State of Ohio:

1. Mass gatherings are prohibited in the State of Ohio.
2. Mass gatherings are defined as any event or convening that brings together *fifty (50) or more* persons in a single room or single space at the same time, such as an auditorium, stadium, arena, large conference room, meeting hall, or any other confined indoor or outdoor space. This would also include parades, fairs and festivals. While not mandatory, it is strongly recommended that Ohioans avoid unnecessary non-family social gatherings of more than ten (10) people in accordance with President Trump's coronavirus guidelines issued March 16, 2020.
