## ORDINANCE NO. 03-18

### AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE ELECTRIC FUND NECESSARY TO PAY AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

**Section 1:** The prior appropriations regarding the fund set forth below is hereby modified so as to appropriate additional money as follows:

**Section 2.** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary to maintain the public health, safety and welfare as these funds are for additional appropriations necessary to pay American Electric Power for the tap fee for the new substation. The agreement to pay the tap fee has already been approved with Ord #30-16 and a purchase order was done for the \$450,000.00 in 2017. This purchase order should have been left open going into 2018 as we have not been billed for the tap fee yet but the purchase order was closed in error. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

**Section 3.** In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
