ORDINANCE NO. 38-19

AN ORDINANCE BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF JACKSON, OHIO TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE AFSCME / AFL-CIO LOCAL #3619, THE BARGAINING UNIT, FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, AND TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY AND BARGAINING UNIT AS REQUIRED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City has engaged in negotiations with the bargaining unit, hereinafter referred to as "the Union", representing certain employees of the City of Jackson, resulting in an agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto, which is to be approved and adopted as the contract between the City and the Union personnel; and


WHEREAS, finalizing the contract between the City and the Union is necessary to preserve the health, safety and welfare of the City and its citizens and for the further reason that the current contract is due to expire, this matter constitutes an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON TO ENTER INTO AND TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT WITH THE UNION, LOCAL 3619, AS ATTACHED HERETO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal acts of this council concerning and relating to adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this council and that the deliberations of the council and any of its committees resulted in such formal action, were in meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
