ORDINANCE NO. 37- 21

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND AMENDING THE CITY OF JACKSON'S CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 921.13 ON CONTRIBUTIONS IN AID TO CONSTRUCTION.

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Jackson has published certain general and permanent ordinances in a volume of Codified Ordinances including section 921.13 for contributions in aid to construction; and

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Jackson has determined it necessary to revise section 921.13 as to contributions in aid to construction; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO THAT SECTION 921.13 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON BE REPEALED AND AMENDED AS TO THE CONTRIBUTIONS IN AID TO CONSTRUCTION, AS SET FORTH BELOW WITH THOSE STRUCK THROUGH PORTIONS BEING REMOVED AND REPLACED WITH THE UNDERLINED LANGUAGE SHOWING THE AMENDMENTS TO THE ORIGINAL LANGUAGE AND THAT IT BE REPLACED WITHIN THE JACKSON CITY CODE, IN REGULAR TEXT.

921.13 CONTRIBUTIONS IN AID TO CONSTRUCTION.

(a) Annually, the Service-Safety Director shall require from a new customer a contribution in aid to construction based upon an annual cost to service analysis, as a condition to constructing new or expanded facilities for electric service.

(b) The annual cost to serve shall be the sum of the following components: Charges and rates for the following items shall be set by the Director of Public Service and Safety and Head of Electric Department and published in the City of Jackson Utility Charges to be maintained in the City of Jackson Utility Office:

(1) Annual fixed costs of the distribution facilities related to the new customer's requirements. Cost for each new secondary pole.

(2) Annual purchased power costs based on the latest available purchased power costs related to the new customer's annual requirements. Cost for each new single phase primary pole.

(3) Annual fixed costs of the new local facilities necessary to provide the service requested. Cost for each new 3-phase primary pole.

(4) Cost per foot for single phase underground line.

(5) Cost per foot for 3-phase underground line.

(6) Cost for each single phase overhead or underground transformer.

(7) Cost for each 3-phase overhead or underground transformer.

(8) Cost per foot for ditch opening and closing.

~~(c) A contribution in aid to construction shall be required when the annual cost to serve exceeds the increase in annual revenue, or for loads of fifty kilowatts or less, when the local facilities cost exceeds the increase in annual revenue. The contribution in aid to construction is calculated as the sum of all poles required multiplied by the cost per pole and/or total footage multiplied by cost per foot plus the transformer cost less the tap fee.~~

~~(d) The contribution in aid to construction is calculated as follows:~~

~~(1) For fifty kilowatts or less, the amount of the contribution in aid to construction is the difference between the local facilities costs and the estimated annual revenue.~~

~~(2) For loads over 50 KW, the amount of contribution in aid to construction is equal to the difference between the annual cost to serve as calculated and the estimated revenue for one year divided by the annual carrying charge rate, but not to exceed the installed cost of the new facilities.~~

~~(3) For facilities in excess of standard service, the amount of the contribution in aid to construction is equal to the difference between the local facilities cost for standard service and the actual local facilities cost.~~

~~(d) Miscellaneous:~~

~~(1) The tap fee shall be sole charge in the event the customer is utilizing an existing transformer and requires no additional work~~

~~(2) The City shall bear the cost for additional improvements requested by the City which are not required to support the new service.~~

~~(3) The Service/Safety Director may waive any costs herein.~~

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and the deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
