## RESOLUTION NO. 18-15

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE AUDITOR OF THE COUNTY OF JACKSON TO CERTIFY THE TOTAL TAX VALUATION AND REVENUE THAT WILL BE GENERATED UPON A RENEWAL OF A 1.5 MILL CEMETERY LEVY FOR THE CITY OF JACKSON AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, without the levy there will be insufficient funds for the operation of the cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the Cemetery Levy issue will be presented to the Jackson County Board of Elections for inclusion on the ballot for the 2016 primary election; and

WHEREAS, in order to determine the revenue generated by the renewal of the levy for the cemetery, it is necessary to have the County Auditor certify to this Council the total tax valuation and revenue that will be generated by a 1.5 mill cemetery levy pursuant to R.C. section 5705.19(T) for the purpose of maintaining and operating Fairmont Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, the certificate is necessary to preserve and protect the health, safety and welfare of the City and its citizens and this matter and this matter is subject to a deadline in order to be included on the primary ballot and, therefore, this matter constitutes an emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON THAT THE JACKSON COUNTY AUDITOR IS REQUESTED TO CERTIFY TO THE CITY OF JACKSON THE TOTAL TAX VALUATION AND REVENUE THAT WILL BE GENERATED UPON A RENEWAL OF A 1.5 MILL CEMETERY LEVY AND THAT THIS MATTER CONSTITUES AN EMERGENCY.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal acts of this council concerning and relating to adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this council and that the deliberations of the council and any of its committees resulted in such formal action, were in meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
